### How we tested this website

We appointed Manta Ray Media to conduct an extensive audit of this website, systematically checking the site against a set of the W3C WAI Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.1 published by Elsevier ([https://romeo.elsevier.com/accessibility\\_checklist/](https://romeo.elsevier.com/accessibility_checklist/)) We undertake an audit of content uploaded to our Website annually. We also conduct manual testing against known content that is due for updating against accessibility issues which are not able to be found through automated testing.

### How we are improving accessibility
